We have no preference.

4. How long are your auditors typically performing fieldwork (in-person or remote) and how many individuals (partner, manager, seniors) are on the audit team?

Transaction and cut-off testing usually occurs soon after year-end. We receive our final sales tax payment during the second week of February and our preliminary OPEB actuarial report in the beginning of March after which our final adjustments are made. On the most recent audit, we provided signed-off financial statements on April 3.

It has usually been a manager, supervisor or senior, and a staff person, either in-house or outsourced, assigned to the account with either a partner or principal overseeing the activity.

5. When you think about your relationship with your existing audit firm - what do you enjoy and is there anything that you would like to change?

We have had a productive working relationship.

6. Can you provide the fees and hours related to the most recent audit? If so, did the fees include additional billings?

NIFA paid a \$50,000 flat fee for the most recent audit.
